

This paper presents an enquiry in to possibilistic logic and Hume's philosophy of *An Enquiry Concerning Human Understanding*. As far as being a tool for reasoning under uncertainty possibilistic logic seems to be an appropriate model for empiric theory of truth. However, as we see the possibilistic consequence as customary transition, the possibilistic logic's ability to claim that classical first-order closed formula cannot be proved ceases to exist. Moreover, the possibilistic semantics coping with inconsistency becomes from this point of view senseless.
