## **ANNOTATION**

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The bachelor's thesis deals with the issue of disease perception in women after hysterectomy. The theoretical part is initially focused on the anatomy and physiology of the uterus, the next chapter deals with a separate hysterectomy, subchapters are focused on the most common indications for hysterectomy, surgical procedures and complications. The following chapters describe changes in the body after uterine removal, nursing care and the patient's own conception of the disease, which is important for proper education and cooperation in treatment.

The focus of the work is a quantitative research using an abbreviated version of the IPQ-R-CZ questionnaire supplemented by demographic data of patients and possible causes of the disease. The examined sample consists of hospitalized patients after hysterectomy.
