The Dichotomy of Ukrainian Identity

Abstract

This thesis addresses dichotomy of the Ukrainian identities using two parallel Ukrainian

narratives. In search for conflict lines, we look at 20th ct. milestones which played a major

role in the formation of such dichotomy. An emphasis is placed on the modernization of

Ukrainian society in 1920s and 1930s. We also analyze the impact of the unformed

Russian Empire and Soviet Union supranational building process on the formation of

these two Ukrainian narratives up to the contemporary Ukrainian state. The conclusion of

this thesis suggests that estimating a definitive shape of the Ukrainian identity will only be

possible after a new supranational Eastern Slavic Identity has been shaped.
