Annotation

The Bosnian war that took place from 1992–1995 was one of the most cruel war conflict in modern history. There was engaged international alliance with pivotal role of United States in it. Despite the fact that the United States was quite reluctant to be significantly engaged in conflict, in the end it was just United States that was the most significant international participant as Americans persuaded all aggressors to sign Dayton Peace Agreement. The primary source of analyze will be declassified sources "National Security Documents" that are published in Clinton Digital Library. Time frame of this thesis is period from 1991–1995, whereas the fundamental part of thesis works with period of 1993–1995.
