Contribution

Thesis examines question of behaviour of elected city officials, and how it is related to their probability of re-election. Admittedly, the causality can go both ways – a) perceived re-election chances lead to increase in various malpractice in public procurement, or b) the increased malpractice reduces chances of re-election. The results are rather mediocre, showing no strong evidence about either. Thesis however demonstrate a novel method of use of contract registry dataset (which has almost unparalleled scope abroad), namely in terms of proper cleaning and linking to microeconomic activity of municipalities. In future this might get used in further replications including larger sample of institutions and/or election cycles.

Methods

The procurement and mainly contract registry data went through several rounds of cleaning, which required both technological and economic know how, e.g. proper categorisation of spendings, setting of thresholds etc. After this complex exercise (which we needed to refine couple of times) we got the core dataset for econometric examination.

There were many trials and errors with various model specifications and approaches to transform input data, which have not been fully recorded in the thesis. At some point I convinced Adam not to go for further attempts and rather record that we found no strong evidence to support most of the hypotheses – unpopular, but honest conclusion.

Obviously, there are plenty of determinants for complex thing like re-election, and procurement behavior is far from the strongest ones. A larger sample or longer time-frame might produce more convincing results.

Literature

The use of sources and literature research is sufficient and well reflects the scope of thesis.

Manuscript form

In some respects the thesis is rather minimalistic – it is lacking better annex describing other approaches author experimented with, that would more convincingly demonstrate stability of the results. Also a more extensive discussion of the results achieved might improve the overall quality. Apart of those omissions, the manuscript is relatively well written.
