

## **Abstract**

The title of this bachelor's thesis reveals that this text deals with right-wing populist parties - SPD and AfD and their comparison according to how they communicate the expulsion of Germans from Czechoslovakia. For the needs of this thesis, I chose the method of discursive analysis. The aim was to provide a deeper look into the communication of the expulsion of the Germans, to define the differences in communication, and, on that basis, to compare the parties. In the conclusions, I write, for example, about the lack or minimal communication of excesses during the expulsion, by the SPD party, or about a declaration between these two parties from June 2019. According to this declaration, the AfD had to accept the condition of not opening historical issues and especially of Beneš decrees. An interesting finding of this analysis is also the fact that both parties have a similar attitude to the Sudetendeutsche Landsmannschaft, although each for a different reason.

The thesis also contains an extensive historical part, in which I deal with the causes and genesis of the expulsion of Germans, this part is longer in scope but serves mainly for readers who are not familiar with the topic of expulsion and offers them a comprehensive insight into this issue. In the practical part of this work, I dealt mainly with the theory of the right and right-wing populism. Subsequently, according to the chosen criteria, I classified both parties as right-wing populist.
