Comments, explaining strengths and weaknesses (at least 300 words):

The Master thesis of Xiangyi Kong is focused on the topic connected with Trade Effects of the EU-Turkey Customs Union. The thesis is divided into seven main chapters. In the first chapter author deals with short introduction. The second chapter introduces basic data about development and structure of Customs Union between EU and Turkey. The third chapter provides theoretical background in form of literature review which enables to understand and get to know basic overview about previous and current research. The internal part of this chapter is also the description of used methodology. In this case author worked with Gravity model. The fourth chapter describes current state of trade between Turkey and the EU. In the fifth chapter author provides practical use of methodological concept in the case trade and economic relations between Turkey and the EU. Sixth chapter deals with the empirical research where author analyzes different data and statistics and evaluates their different effects on trade between the EU and Turkey. Last chapter is devoted to conclusions and suggestions.

Regarding the content processing author has proved theoretical and empirical knowledge of selected topic. He has worked with many different types of literature and has showed the ability to process and analyze. The theoretical and empirical part is balanced.

From the formal point of view I would propose the different structure of the thesis since the topic should starts with literature review and with the methodology description and hypothesis/research questions definition. I would also propose not mark Introduction and Conclusion as the first/seventh chapter. The aim of these parts is to introduce and sum up basic information about the content and structure of the thesis.

To conclude, the strengths of the thesis are analyses of the actual topic of the EU-Turkey Customs Union according to many data with using of Gravity model. The weaknesses are mostly in formal part of the thesis.
