<i>The chosen examination techniques in the initial and final kinesiological examination correspond to the knowledge of the bachelor's study programme. Their selection is adequate to the diagnosis and their record includes correct location, performance and author.</i>

<i>The therapeutic techniques used are appropriately chosen and reflect a comprehensive approach to patient therapy (thromboembolic prevention, passive stretching, respiratory therapy, PIR, PIR with stretching, PNF, soft tissue tension modification techniques, mobilization techniques, systematic and analytical strengthening techniques. Techniques are also used to modify basic movement stereotypes and ADLs. Instruction and assignment of self-therapy is part of the therapy designed and provided.</i>

<i>The evaluation of the therapy is done in a separate chapter (chapter 3.7) in a very brief description. The description completely lacks information on the specific effect of the therapy on individual clinical findings.</i>

<i>The final evaluation lacks an assessment of the work in relation to current (published and practical) knowledge. The thesis also lacks an evaluation of the fulfilment of the objectives of the bachelor thesis.</i>				

4. Additional commentary and evaluation, questions for defence:

Despite the little criticisms mentioned above, the work of Mr. Seyed Sadrocin Nourbakhsh meets the requirements for the completion of a bachelor's degree in physiotherapy. The student worked independently in completing the thesis and was able to respond to comments and criticisms.

I recommend the thesis for defence. As part of the defence, I ask the student to explain if and why it would be appropriate to use systematic techniques such as sensorimotor stimulation.
