

## **Abstract**

This thesis seeks to offer a more comprehensive and profound understanding of human rights violations in migration, taking as a case study the territory of Mexico as a migratory corridor due to its importance which has catalogued it not only as the main migratory corridor in Latin America but also as the busiest in the world.
