Evaluation

Major criteria:

The present work explores the narratives associated with the Russian Hybrid War that resonate on the News Front platform. The author monitors Slovak, Serbian, English and Russian content. A fundamental contribution of the research is the thesis of tailormade propaganda that thematizes events with respect to geographical, cultural or political context. The author captures in a solid way the principles of Russian information warfare and the logic of manipulative news. However, the research lacks a more sophisticated framework through which to systematically track content on the New Front. Thus, the resulting empirical analysis provides an interesting illustration of tailormade and broadly applied narratives in principle but feels shallow in places. On the other hand, one must appreciate the honest empirical work and the author's talented approach to interpreting narratives.
