This thesis deals with pregnancy complicated by the presence of systemic rheumatic disease, systemic lupus erythematosus. Further analyzes and antiphospholipid syndrome in pregnancy, which can be separately, when we talk about the primary antiphospholipid syndrome, or may be associated with a magnifying glass to the system secondary antiphospholipid syndrome.

The work seeks to provide an overview of new knowledge about diagnosis and treatment, but most focus on the relationship of these units to pregnancy, development of the fetus, birth and postpartum complications and also the question of how pregnancy affects theactivity systemic lupus erythematosus
