Summary:

This bachelor's thesis in theoretical part is dealing with a complex issue of domestic violence from everyday practice of health care professionals from emergency care service within 3 regions of the Czech Republic (Central Bohemian region, Pardubice Region and Vysočina Region). It gives a basic information summary about a domestic violence, its causes, forms, dynamics and even consequences.

Significant part of this thesis focuses on need of professional approach of health care professionals nursing staff and medical staff in a process of multidisciplinary cooperation towards victims of domestic violence.

There is a structured interview in the research part dealing with health care of professional nurse, driver, medical doctor and medical operator for emergency rescue service. At the above mentioned 3 regions there was carried out questionnaire survey (returnability 68%); with 406 filled questionnaire. Research group was made up of 185 men and 221 women (34MDs, 40 medical operators for emergency rescue service, 233 nurses and rescue service professionals and 99 drivers).

Research investigation showed, that health care professionals of the rescue services have experience with treatment of domestic violence victims and they have got effort to provide the optimal care for these victims.

Till today there is no made standard for dealing with victims of domestic violence. Also feedback about a future life of the victims of domestic violence is insufficient.
