

My dissertation work called “The quality of life within selected groups of clients with the Crohn’s disease” is analysing the subjective evaluation of the clients’ life situation, that describes their day-to-day struggle with this chronic disease. This work is divided into two parts, theoretical and empirical. The objective of the former is to present the current findings about the Crohn’s disease, to describe the term “quality of life”, defines its various meanings and history and specifies the assessment methods in the clinical practice.

In the latter, there are set objectives and working hypotheses for own evaluation. The target of the empirical part is to obtain real life data through questioning methods, partly based on the standardised WHQL-BREF methodology. The obtained data will be subjected to primary analysis in order to create an evaluation result for a selected group of clients. In the last part, this dataset will be compared with the previously measured values on quality of life of clients with Crohn’s disease.
