

ABSTRACT

The introductory study presents overall Apollonius Dyscolus, the most significant ancient greek grammarian. It deals with his person, important technical issues of his work, and particularly with his grammar study, focusing on fundamental grammar classifications and thought structure. The introductory study is accompanied by the translation of a few introductory chapters (GG II,1,1,3.1-17.17) of Apollonius' treatise Περί ἀντωνυμίας (*Peri antonymias, On Pronouns*), and by scholarly commentary to the translation.
