## **OVERALL ASSESSMENT** (provided in English, Czech, or Slovak):

This thesis examines how inflation targets are set in emerging markets economies. To a certain degree, it is a follow-up research on an article by Horvath and Mateju (2011) published in International Finance. Nevertheless, it extends the previous literature in a number of ways. It focuses specifically on emerging markets, updates the datasets and examines the disinflation efforts in a greater detail. Interestingly, while there are dozens of articles assessing the effect of inflation targeting, very little attention is paid in academic community to the issue of how inflation targets are set. This is important also from policy perspective because of several recent proposals to increase the inflation targets in developed countries.

Elod has undertaken substantial data collection and applied appropriate econometric methods. The inflation target is set as an interval and therefore, Elod applied interval panel regression models that treat this issue adequately. The thesis contains excellent literature survey and econometrics is carried out competently. The thesis reads very well and provides an interesting extension of previous research.

I suggest the grade A for Elod and eventually consider for Dean Award.


