Abstract

The subject of the bachelor thesis is the Egyptian revolution from the beginning of the year 2011. The main goal is to find out the key consequences having led to the outbreak. At the end, the sequence of events during the revolution and the country's development since President Hosni Mubarak's resignation will be shortly described. That will be followed by a brief summary of presidential and parliamentary elections.
