Title of the thesis:	The monetary policy and financial stress: the empirical analysis

OVERALL ASSESSMENT (provided in English, Czech, or Slovak):

The aim of this thesis is to quantify the influence of macroeconomic shocks on Financial Stress Index (FSI) using an SVAR model. In the first part, the author defines financial stress and describes the nexus phenomena. Despite the author claims to be aware of limits of various financial stress indices, part 1.2, p.13, §1, he only introduces labels of groups of variables used for his selected Financial Stress Index, p.15, §1, l.5-6.

Part methodology is well balanced in providing reasons why or why not to rely on selected SVAR model. Here I must say it goes beyond my knowledge and I don't feel it would be adequate to add any comments. It seems to be too good. However, the next part of Data descriptive statistics, 3.1, p.26-29 is in contrast by its depth but at least shows the ability of author to describe a chart.

In part.3.4, p.33, author finds significant relations among variables which I found to be intuitive. It is very likely that the FSI includes these macroeconomic variables already. **Could author give some examples of macroeconomic variables included in the Financial Stress Index?**

Part 3.5, p.35-42 provide Impulse Response functions. Chapter 4, p.43 concludes briefly.

Overall, this is an excellent bachelor thesis, written briefly with a strong focus on the result. The only point of critics might go to the Black Box nature of presented FSI. As the author warns in the beginning from the financial over-engineering and portfolio approach as one of the causes of the latest financial crisis, he does the same when not presenting the variables composing the FSI and checking the impulse responses probably of the same variables as FSI contains. Anyway, the incontestable value added is the quantification.

Aside of that, I only found minor typographic mistakes:

- There is a minor arithmetic/typographic mistake on p.18, section 2.1, §1, l.1 – there should be „Two” instead of „Three”.
- In section 3.1, descriptive statistics table, minimum for GDP growth should have a minus sign (to be -3.4).
- Table 2 and table 3, p.31-32, in part 3.3 might look much more rigor if made as a LaTeX matrix, for example.
- I don't understand what is the meaning of the last sentence on p.32, it looks there's some extra text left.

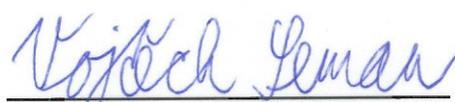
