OVERALL ASSESSMENT (provided in English, Czech, or Slovak):

The thesis submitted by Michal Prause is a well structured, high-level work in the field of theoretical microeconomics. The author in his thesis uses a framework of Pay-to-Play lobbying model in which the decision maker grants the lobbying party an access to present information to the decision maker in exchange for a financial contributions. The interest group has therefore an opportunity to affect the decision of a politician acording to her own preferences.

According to my knowledge this thesis is an exceptional piece of work. It proves that the author can manage a highly-theoretical research topic, formal correctness of the thesis and even make contribution to the most recent literature published in the field in 2015. I am pleased to summarize at the beginning of this report that the author managed all aspects of the thesis well and I especially appraise the originality and contribution to the field as exceptional (on the bachelor level). Therefore, based on the quality of the entire thesis I can honestly suggest the highest grade ("1". i.e. "excellent").

The thesis first place the Pay-to-Play lobying models within an existing literature. It describes types of lobbying, interest groups, contributions and information as the instruments of political influence. Furthemore, the thesis continues with the introduction of four consecutive Pay-to-Play models ending up by the most recent literature of Gregor (2015). The literature is clearly stated and well cited making very good impression of authors knowledge of the field.

The cornerstone of the thesis then lies in its fourth chapter in which the author defines the model of Pay-to-Play lobbying game and discusses the effect of four different policy functions on the equilibria of the game. To the author's benefit all components of the model are very clearly defined, the effects of different policy functions discussed in the thorough manner. The thesis follows in the same spirit with the analysis of the "Curse of the ex ante advantege" and endogeneously given private values of interest groups. The author conlcudes his research that neither the curse nor the destruction of the lobbiyng industry through endogeneous valuations are robust for all policy functions discussed ion the thesis.

The author is also well aware of the theoretical shortcommings of his work. When there is a speculation for an extension through discussion of additional parameter changes the author gives a brief note that he leaves the topic for examination in future studies.

In the case of a manuscript form I found a minority of deficiencies. I include following short list in the report only to provide the author with a feedback of another "pair of eyes" which can improve the work. None of the following points are important enough to decrease the value of this thesis.

- Page 18 footnote 3 ..used in different a meaning..
- Page 24 ..her decision to by backed by evidence.
- Page 26 and and her expected policy utility
- Page 31 This however hurts the the DM...
