

Abstract

This paper deals with the main geopolitical aspects of India-Bangladesh relation. It covers the process of creation of the Indo-Bangladesh border, problems originating from its constitution including the Cooch Behar enclaves and efforts of the both countries to resolve these problems by the means of bilateral treaties. It also focuses on illegal migration from Bangladesh to India, analyses its causes and its influence on the security in the North-east India and Indian political scene. Disputes concerning the fresh-water sharing, emerging from Indian dams and irrigation canals, either already built, or planned. The last part deals with possible connection between one of the aspects of the global warming, sea-level rising, and migration.
