

Robert Flieder ranked among the Czechoslovakian diplomats, which took part on establishment on Czechoslovakian diplomacy. After his study in the Faculty of Law in Prague he became his carrier as official on Prague municipal authorities, during it he try to habilitate in the Charles Univerzity.

At the end of the first World war he become the Secretary of Czech association in Wien. After the establishment of the independent Czechoslovakia he took part in the likvidation of union with Austrian-Hungarian Empire. After that he entered diplomatic service. During his diplomatic carier he worked as a Czechoslovakian Ambassador in Switzerland (1921 - 1924), in Poland (1924-1927), in Sweden, in Norway and Litvuania (1927-1930), in Yugoslavia (1930-1933) and in Spain and Portugal (1935-1937).

After his return to Prague he become the head of the legal department in the Ministry of Foreign Affaires. After German occupation he was entrusted with liquidation of the Ministry. After that in 1941 he was sent to retirement.

For his resistance activity he was sent before the end of the war to prison., he was taken ill and for the healthy reasons he didnt return back after the war to active servi ce. After the year 1948 he was oppressed and was not permitted actively worked. This sigmatized the end of his life.
