Abstract

This bachelor's thesis deals with finger alphabets and their usage in the education of children with hearing impairment. The theoretical part is made up of three chapters, where the author describes the particular types of finger alphabets (one-handed, two-handed) and their form, outlines their historical progress in the areas of the Czech republic and in the global scale, when introducing examples of their use.
