

This thesis deals with the personality of the Premysl Pitter, a time in which he lived. He was a man of humanism, tolerance, democracy supporter, ecumenism and one of the few who help without having. The aim of the thesis is to familiarize the reader with the most important events and aspects of his life. The work is divided into ten chapters and each will concentrate on one period in his life. The first chapter describes his childhood until his return from the World War I. In the second chapter, I tried to handle the growth of his thoughts and ideas in a European context. The third chapter is entitled "Milič's house," where Premysl and his colleagues care for children of lower Zizkov. The fourth deals with "The Castles". The fifth chapter is called Pitter escape from Czechoslovakia. In the sixth chapter describes his work in the refugee camp Valka. The seventh chapter is devoted to his publishing work and stay in Switzerland. Eighth entitled "An educator and didactic activity" here, I tried to outline its most important pedagogical benefits and principle. The ninth chapter deals with life colleague of Pitter about Olga Fierz. The last chapter was compiled in table form, which I chose for its lucidity. In it, I carried the most important chronological dates, celebrities, whom he met, his writings and world events that occurred during his lifetime. Thanks to this year, significantly 600th anniversary of the burning of Master Jan Hus, I incorporated the most important table in Hus's accents in the formation of Premysl Pitter. Also, since I am writing thesis at the Hussite Faculty of Charles University, I dared to table process Pitter's track in the Czechoslovak Hussite Church and the Hussite Theological Faculty of Charles University. Text of Annex I completed, which is authentically recorded interview with witness Miroslav Matthew. At the end, I joined a picture attachment, which consists of photographs documenting the life and mission of Premysl Pitter.
