

Abstract

The work deals with participatory democracy and citizen's involvement in co-decision procedure in Prague 7 district, considering a particularly case of a planned construction of a shopping mall. The case study focuses on possibilities of involvement of the citizens of the particular district in co-decision procedures and provides an insight into this issue from the citizen's point of view. Another topic of this case study is citizen's perception of the issue connected with the opening of the shopping mall, considering the increase in traffic and the environmental impact using an example of increased concentration of carbon dioxide in the inspected locality.
