Abstract

The topic of the master thesis is the interpretation of "freedom" in the existential philosophy of Martin Heidegger. This thesis is divided into three chapters. The first one is dedicated to the turn in Heidegger's philosophy from the "metaphysics of subjectivity" to a fundamental analysis of Dasein. The second chapter deals with Heidegger's concept of "truth" as the unclosedness of Dasein in the world, and the third discusses his concept of "freedom", seen as the horizon of open possibilities. Both concepts are based on Martin Heidegger's crucial work *Being and Time*. The aim of the thesis is to determine how Heidegger interpreted freedom in his early philosophy, and how it was elaborated on in his existential analytics of Dasein.
