Jan Mertl and the Concept of "Authoritative Democracy"

Abstract: This text focuses on the shift that the political sociologist Jan Mertl has undergone in the 1930s, moving away from empirial sociological analysis through a critique of the Czechoslovak republic to the support of the concept of limited, "authoritative" democracy.
