

Abstrakt

This diploma thesis deals with the present circumstances of international labor migration with accent on daily cross-border work trips at the microregional level. The matter of international job migration started to be actual in the beginning of the nineties of the 20th century and its importance increased in connection with the accession of the Czech Republic to the EU. The research was realized in the region of Cheb as the sole region of Czech-Bavarian borderland in which there are statistical data.

The thesis is introduced by theoretical and methodological summary being followed by socio-demographic analysis of the concerned area. It is summed up by a survey of the mayors in the region. The next part is devoted to international labor migration in the region. There are characterised main kinds of migration such as long-term, season and daily cross-border work trips.

The next section focuses on specific data of daily cross-border workers based on the survey. The research reveals reasons, work relations and consequences on the personal and professional life of workers in the Czech Republic.

This theme is also explored by the analysis of conditionality in daily cross-border workers' localization. The conditionality was discovered by stepwise regression. The results provide complex insight of this broad issue.
