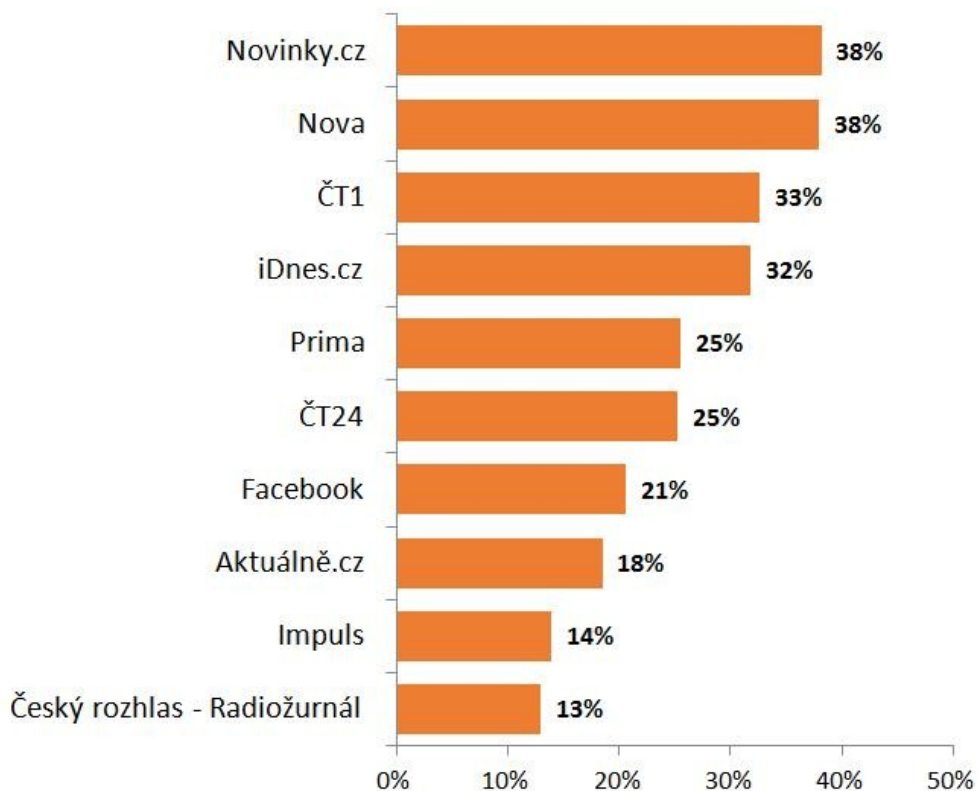

LIFE IN THE CZECH REPUBLIC

Freedom of speech is a fundamental right.
In the Czech Republic, everyone has the right to freedom of expression. You shouldn't be afraid to speak up and defend your rights.

The Czech Republic is a democratic country.
All people have equal rights. The citizens of the Czech Republic may decide who will administer the country through free elections.

Religion is a private matter.
Everyone has the right to choose their religion or none at all. Respect the personal decision of others.

Women and men are equal.
Women make the same decisions regarding their life as men. Men may work in professions just like women. Only a person under 18 years of age may enter into marriage.

The law takes precedence over religion.
All actions made in accordance with religious laws and regulations must also be in accordance with the law.

The Czech Republic abides by the rule of law.
Violations in the country are regulated by laws and regulations. Laws and regulations must be applied equally to all people without any exceptions.

Parents are responsible for the behaviour of their children.
Both parents are equally responsible for the behaviour of their children. The minimum age of criminal responsibility for children is 15 years of age.

All children in the Czech Republic must complete compulsory education lasting nine years.
Any failure to adhere to compulsory education conditions is a criminal offence. Boys and girls attend the same school. They are taught together, regardless of their religious or ethnic background.

Domestic violence and sexual harassment is prohibited.
Any violence against women and children as well as sexual harassment is prohibited by law. Victims of violence are advised to help themselves by reporting the crime to the police.

People of the same sex may live together and enter into a registered partnership in the Czech Republic.
A woman may live in a partnership with another woman and a man may live with another man. They can bring up children together.

It is not unusual in the Czech Republic that people keep a greater distance while talking.
In public places, observe the rules of personal space. People should not stand too close to each other. It is not usual to touch another person during conversation. It is acceptable to shake hands with a new acquaintance.

When entering a room, it is customary to say hello, and when leaving to say goodbye.
A greeting and a handshake are customary when entering a room. It is customary to shake hands with a new acquaintance. A woman who is invited to a restaurant should not go to the bar and order drinks for herself.

Healthcare services are provided on the basis of health insurance.
Each resident of the Czech Republic must make contributions to public health insurance. Always check whether your insurance is up to date. You are not allowed to work for an employer who is not registered for health insurance. Women may be insured by their partners. Men may be insured by their partners.

It is very important to be punctual.
When going to school, work and appointments, always arrive on time. If you are not able to come on time, it is necessary to inform the person in advance.

Road traffic rules must be respected.
Any failure to comply with the road traffic rules can lead to a penalty or a driving ban. A passenger vehicle may only be driven by a person over 18 years of age. There is strict control of alcohol consumption. It is not allowed to drink or use alcohol in public places. The same rules also apply to pedestrians and cyclists.

Private property must be respected.
For reasons of safety, do not park your car on sidewalks. Do not park agricultural crops on sidewalks. Do not park your car on sidewalks.

Observe the norms of polite behaviour.
