The Specifics of Children Interrogation

Abstract

This diploma thesis deals with the interrogation of children in criminal

proceedings, with a focus on the specifics that are characteristic of it.

The aim of the thesis is to provide a comprehensive overview of this issue at

all levels - legal, psychological, as well as criminal, and to allow better understanding

of its whole essence.

In this introduction, the thesis focuses on the legal standpoint, in which it

introduces the basic terms and outlines the current state of legislation in the Czech

Republic. Then, it moves continuously to the psychological-criminal standpoint,

where it reaches the point of its content - the specifics that may arise in connection

with the interrogation of children.

The thesis views these specifics from two different angles. From a

psychological point of view, it enables to understand the complexity of a child's

personality, which must always be taken into account during the interrogation. It also

points out any risks that may arise in communicating with the child and which should

be avoided. From the criminal point of view, it focuses directly on the course of

interrogation itself. This practical part can thus be considered as a guide step by step

through the whole interrogation. It deals in detail with all subsequent stages in which

states, inter alia, under what conditions it should take place, how it should be

conducted and, on the contrary, what the interrogating officer should avoid. In both

directions, it always seeks to complement all theoretical knowledge with expert

advice and recommendations, confronting their differing views at the same time. In its

conclusion, it provides a directed interview with one of the interrogated child witness

and thus also provides an insight into police practice in Prague.

This diploma thesis, in its entirety, gives comprehensive knowledge to all

those who show a lay interest in this issue, or who want to expand their acquired

knowledge with in further depth.
