The detective genre originated in the first half of the 19th century and it does not seem to be loosing its pace. On the contrary, new authors have been occurring, bringing new rules and attitudes to the classical formo Detective novel is usually closely connected to the settings it describes. The aim of this thesis is to find out specific features ofthe Sicilian detective novel. We have chosen two authors and their works for a detailed analysis: Leonardo Sciascia and his novels II giorno della civefta and A ciascuno il suo and Andrea Camilleri and his La forma dell' acqua and II cane di terracofta. The thesis has two parts. Part one has three chapters: in first chapter we deal with the history of detective novel, the European detective style and the Anglo - Saxon style, or the classical and American detective stories. In chapter two, we focus on the isle of Sicily, its history and the unique character of its inhabitants and their culture. In the final chapter, we pay attention to the works of the most famous Sicilian writer Luigi Pirandello e. g.Ilfu Maftia Pascal or Cosi e (se vi pare), his search for reality, human identity and the relativity of the truth, all of which occur in Sicilian detective stories.
