Reviewer 1

This dissertation provides excellent evidence-based analysis of Pakistan's counterterrorism strategy, the National Action Plan. This study offers a timely and comperehensive analysis of the policy, extending its analytical insights further than previous scholarly and policy-report works have done.

The student expanded his analysis of NAP to encompass not only typical areas of analysis, such as effectiveness and implementation, but also into the realms of local socio-cultural milieu, analysing the effect of NAP on transformation (or the lack thereof) of local traditions, culture and forms of traditional (tribal) organisation in areas where NAP was implemented. This is a major contribution of this dissertation to existing studies and analyses of counterterrorism in Pakistan.

The dissertation demonstrates excellent engagement with both conceptual and theoretical literature, as well as effective application of theory to a case study. The student has shown not only close familiarity with literature pertinent to the case study, but also with a broader and diverse body of research on counterterrorism.

Above all, the strongest part of this dissertation is it reliance on original interview data collected specifically for the purposes of this research work. In-depth interviews with a wide range of informants shed light on previously unreported dynamics and processes and provide us with unique empirical insights. The student should be praised for undertaking this online fieldwork in times of pandemic and succeeding in recruting a decent number of interview participants across different walks of life. Interview data, particularly related to socio-cultural aspects in Pashtun tribal areas, have positively enriched the empirical contribution and originality of this dissertation.
