

In this work, we analyze the spirituality of evangelical churches, namely the Pražské Společenství Kristovo, which is representative of the group. In the introduction we describe what spirituality is and what influences the individual, as well as the congregational experience of a relationship with God. Spirituality as such can be divided, based on Geoffrey Wainwright's work, into five types which is described further in the work. At the beginning of the work, spirituality of evangelical churches is introduced rather generally, according to historical progression of the churches presenting themselves as of the Awakening tradition. Then, spirituality is looked at from the angle of specific differences in experience of spirituality of evangelical Christians. Later, when using the example of Christians' experience in their relationship with God belonging to the International Churches of Christ, that is, Christians from the Pražské Společenství Kristovo, spirituality is described more in detail. Spirituality of this church, presenting itself as belonging to the Discipleship churches tradition, is being shown through documenting and analyzing their specific Spiritual training of converts before and after baptism, as well as through diversions in this training appearing recently (also thanks to great sociological and ecclesiological changes in this church). This development is documented by a survey made among the members of this church, where these Christians could evaluate their own experience of having a relationship with God in the years 2002 and 2009.
