ATTITUDES OF PHARMACISTS AND PHARMACY TECHNICIANS TOWARDS

COMPLEMENTARY AND ALTERNATIVE MEDICINE

Background: The popularity of complementary and alternative medicine (CAM) is increasing

and becoming more and more competition for conventional medicine. Opinions on the CAM

among pharmacists and pharmacy technicians have not yet been assessed in the Czech Republic.

Aim: Primarily to evaluace the attitudes of pharmacists and pharmacy technicians to CAM.

Secondarily, to determine if there is a correlation between a positive approach to CAM and

gender, age, length of practice in a pharmacy, a population of place in which the pharmacy is

located, a fiction which the interviewee in a pharmacy performs or educational attainment

(acquired title).

Methods: Within the research project - a pilot survey "Complementary and alternative medicine

- a surfy of opinion on health", we obtain data using a validated anonymous questionnaire. The

questionnaire survey was carried out between 1/2/2009 - 31/5/2009 in selected Czech

pharmacies. The data were evaluated in the komputer programs MS Excel and SPSS.

Results: The vast majority of respondents (92%) have a friendly relationship with

unconventional medicine. A relationship between positive attitude to CAM and age, position in

pharmacy, education (acquiredtitle) and the place where the pharmacy is given by (population)

has not been confirmed. However, we found a correlation between a positive attitude to CAM

and sex of respondents - women (mean score 50.80) have a friendlier attitude toward CAM than

men (meanscore 47.45).

Conclusion: Czech pharmacists and pharmacy technicians are supportive of unconventional

medicine. Further research in this area is desirable.
