### Other notes

- 1. The numbering of individual chapters in Contents is different from the numbering in the text.
- 2. It is much better to write notices at the bottom of individual pages than at the end of chapters. Moreover it is not necessary to evidence the source of each information.
- 3. On the other hand the same is necessary in the case of quotation (see p. 19, 4th paragraph).
- 4. English language is getting worse at the end of thesis, particularly in the chapter Contemporary and Popular Turkish Music.
- 5. In my opinion, the rhythm patterns (pp. 29–38) are too much detailed. They are understandable only for the players.
- 6. It is necessary to appreciate the high quality of photographs.

#### **Ouestions for discussion**

- 1. The author could specify his personal experience with belly dancing and orienthal percussions.
- 2. You used only web sources? Any printed literature?

## Overall assesment of the thesis

The theme of the thesis is original and very interesting for Central European musicians. I appreciate the personal relation of the author to the theme.
