OVERALL ASSESSMENT (provided in English, Czech, or Slovak):

Student Marek Čech has chosen renewable energy sources and their impact on both markets and environment. The topic is quite broad so the thesis starts with an introduction into the field of renewable energy sources (RES) and electricity prices, with the focus on the EU. Econometric analysis follows, hypotheses (to be tested) should answer questions about the impact of RES on electricity prices and on the level of carbon dioxide. The thesis "looks" ok but suffers from significant problem. Unfortunately, after three years of study, the student is not familiar with the citation rules. There are almost no citations in the text, even though (especially) the first part is full of information and figures that have to have some source. It is true, that there is a bibliography list at the end, but it is not connected to the text itself.

See e.g. page 17, second sentence: "As CO2 is the greenhouse gas mostly produced by human activities and is considered to be responsible for about 64% of man-made global warming, we focus...." Where does 64% comes from? Figures with no source repeat throughout the text.

See also page 17 (line 26) and put into Google the following sentence: "By putting a price on carbon and thereby giving a financial value to each tonne of emissions saved, the EU ETS has placed climate change on the agenda of company boards and their financial departments."

Google returns the following: "By putting a price on carbon and thereby giving a financial value to each tonne of emissions saved, the EU ETS has placed climate change on the agenda of company boards and their financial departments across Europe." (http://ec.europa.eu/clima/policies/ets/index en.htm) There are no quotation marks, footnotes or anything that would clearly show that the author of the sentence is somebody else!!! This sentence is not an exception, the same applies to e.g. page 13 "At the same time…" or page 12 "The absolute values,…".

Citing is the core of academic world and bachelor's degree is an academic title, therefore, I consider this to be a serious problem. Thus, if Mr. Čech can explain it, I suggest the grade 3 (satisfactory). Because of the above written I assign no points. What a pity, it could have been an excellent thesis!
