Title of the thesis:	Trading Volume and Volatility in the US Stock Markets

OVERALL ASSESSMENT *(provided in English, Czech, or Slovak):*

The thesis **Trading Volume and Volatility in the US Stock Markets** focuses on the trading volume - volatility of stock returns relationship and Mixture of Distribution Hypothesis. This relationship is tested for 5 US stocks by employing GARCH models augmented by a series of expected and unexpected volumes. Tomáš finds that there seem to exist this relationship and it is positive.

The theoretical part of the thesis is well structured and Tomáš describes all relevant literature and methodology behind his research. I would even say that some methodology is explained too much. In my point of view, common things such as information criteria do not need to be described directly in the text, to reference them is sufficient.

Concerning the data and empirical part of the thesis, both are well written. The data source is clearly defined and all data transformations are stated. Methods employed in the thesis belong to well-known and largely used quantitative finance approaches and are correctly designed to assess research topic. In the non-trivial application of methods used I see the biggest contribution of the thesis as simple stock volatility models are rather extensively investigated topic.

To comment on results, Tomáš clearly states and describes all results in a well-designed and readable way. Some regression results differ from what was originally expected, which is interesting and might be investigated in a further research.

Concerning the layout of the thesis, I have found several issues there and it is why I propose only 10 points out of 20 for a Manuscript Form. First, there are several typing errors in the text and second, some sentences are badly structured. In my point of view, these errors are redundant and can be easily avoided.

Apart from the layout of the thesis, I did not identify any major shortcomings. To conclude, my overall impression of this thesis is positive as it fulfills all standards required for IES bachelor students. Due to this, I assign grade 1 and propose this thesis for a defense.
