OVERALL ASSESSMENT (provided in English, Czech, or Slovak):

In his bachelor thesis, Michal Todt aims to test whether there is intergenerational transmission of education and whether the importance of parental education varies across wealth at country level. The research question is clearly described and important. While the link between parental and individual education has been relatively extensively studied before, the contribution of the thesis is that it compares the effects across dozens of countries. I believe that Michal learned a lot about econometric techniques when writing the thesis. In the main estimates, he uses OLS, but also provides results using other methods to test their robustness.

A drawback of the thesis is that at many places there are grammatical mistakes. Also, the tables with the results could be placed in the text closer to the relevant text. All this makes it somewhat hard to read the text. At some places, the arguments are difficult to understand and sometimes seem to be based on author's subjective opinion. For example, I do not understand the argument that if education gets transmitted across generations, onetime investment in education is better than smaller subsidies every year -- it takes several years to complete one's education, during which education can be subsidized. This might be discussed during the defence.

Despite these drawbacks, I believe the thesis provides new knowledge and fulfills the requirements for a bachelor thesis at IES FSS, Charles University. I am happy to recommend the thesis for the defence and suggest grade B.
