Contribution

The main aim of the work is to study information transmission in the main commodity and equity markets. Special attention is paid to an interesting and important question, if transmission mechanism is symmetric with respect to positive, and negative news as proxied by positive and negative volatility. The main contribution of the work is empirical study that documents asymmetric information transmission channels in the main commodity and stock markets.

Methods

The thesis is competitively executed application of modern techniques, and brings interesting economic findings about behavior of stock markets, as it finds that negative shocks transmit in a different way in comparison to positive ones. With this respect, the thesis is empirical extension of the recent work by Barunik, Kocenda, and Vacha. Furthermore, author describes interesting dynamics of this asymmetric behavior. The methods follow state of art methodological frameworks used in the literature.

Literature

Author demonstrates her deep understanding of the literature, and gives credit to other studies and authors where appropriate.

Manuscript form

The text is logical, well written, connects findings to the existing literature well. Tereza worked consistently to obtain the results during the year, and we have discussed the results and text on a regular basis.

In conclusion, I believe that during the work Tereza proved herself to be an independent researcher, obtained interesting and contributive results, mastered advanced techniques, hence thesis deserves to be defended. In case Tereza is confident in presenting the details of the work during the defense, and *mainly present economic motivation, why she believes the results are important for us economically*, I suggest to award the work with grade "1".
